

'Rainbow Project' has touch of glass May 4, 2013

OAKLEY — Youngsters will have a chance to bring color to a rainbow. The Brazee Street Studios in Oakley is coordinating a "Rainbow Project" for students ages 3 to 18.

"The kids work collaboratively to create a glass rainbow," said instructor Emily Repp, a youth coordinator at Brazee Street Studios.

Each student will work on individual tiles, using different colors and types of glass, to create a section of a rainbow that when combined will fill a small room, said Repp.

"I like that you get to design your own pieces," said Brady Boyer, 7, a participant in the class and a resident of Park Hills, Ky.

Classes started in May, but enrollment is still open. Classes run Thursday through Saturday at various times. Cost to enroll is \$10 per child. The completed rainbow will be on display June 14 through 27, at the studio, which is located at 4426 Brazee Street.
